History <ul style="list-style-type: none">• November 2022 – Open to the public - ChatGPT 3.5• The interface is like Texting/Chat• Prompts and Prompt Engineering• Blaine Bettinger's Facebook group, "Genealogy and Artificial Intelligence," became the central hub for discussions and insights.• GPT 4.0 – predominant model - \$• Accessing ChatGPT = https://platform.openai.com/overview• Adoption Statistics<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Over 160 million worldwide users of ChatGPT daily	Effective Use of Prompts <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Asking the right questions in the right way is critical to getting good output.• New skill – Prompt Engineering Creating a Good Prompt <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Provide Context – Role – "act like"• Use <u>Positive</u> Action Verbs• Clearly State the Desired Topic or Task – what is the Goal• Set Guidelines• Specify the Output Format• Feed It Content or Reference Material• Give it Feedback; Rinse and Repeat

Strategies for Success	
Concepts to Remember <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hallucinations happen – Check, check, check • Not Your Ancestors, Your Ancestors in Context • LLMs (like ChatGPT) are just text predictors; VERY sophisticated text predictors, but the basics are still the same. They are predicting the next "word" in a sequence. • You are the Human in the Equation 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a clear, complete prompt • Don't hesitate to ask again and again – peel the onion • Ask it what it can do • Practice. It takes time to master this skill • Dive in – the water's fine!
